

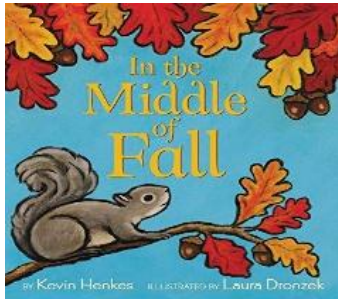


Project Home Learning - Year R & 1

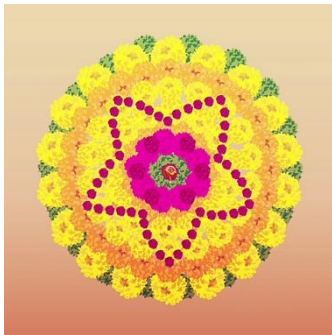
Term 1: The Magic of Me in My World
